Zero conditional

We use the zero conditional to talk about things that are always true.

If you **heat** water, it **boils**.

The present simple is used in both clauses.

IF + present simple → present simple



100%

First conditional

We use the first conditional when we talk about real and possible situations.

I'll go shopping on the way home if I have time.

If it's a nice day tomorrow, we'll go to the beach.



50%

IF + Present simple → Future simple (will)

NEVER use will in the if clause

Second conditional

The second conditional is used to talk about 'unreal' or impossible things.

If I **won** a lot of money, I **'d buy** a big house in the country.

Where **would** you **live** if you **had** money?

IF + **modal past** → **would** + **V**

NEVER use **would** in the **if** clause
